What are the Arts & Humanities Concentrations?

The Arts & Humanities Concentrations consist of a variety of courses where students develop skill, understand concepts, and explore opportunity in depth within the areas of the arts and communication. While these concentrations are available to all students, it is particularly well suited for students who:

- Enjoy creative, innovative, or imaginative activities.
- Enjoy participating in music, visual arts, debate, or theatre.
- Tend to score high on **Artistic** scales when taking interest inventories.
- Are curious about the role of the communications and the arts in our world.
- Are interested in Education, careers, or activities after high school where they can use their artistic and communications talents and interests.
