Students will further develop the leadership skills they acquired in Naval Science 1, 2 and 3 through daily, practical leadership responsibilities.. Students will develop a growing sense of pride in the NJROTC organization, their classmates and themselves. Students will develop advanced reading, writing, and presentation skills in order to be successful in this class. Students will discuss vignettes, scenarios and themes from Naval movies that they may encounter either as a NJROTC cadet or as a senior member in the United States Military. These scenarios and vignettes were developed by the NJROTC curriculum.

RE-DO POLICY:

Uniform Inspections – Students will wear the NJROTC uniform on designated days and will be inspected/ assigned a grade by their Platoon Commander reflecting their correct preparation and wearing of the NJROTC uniform, adherence to expected personal grooming standards, and understanding of required basic military knowledge (e.g., General Orders to the Sentry; Chain of Command).

Unit Tests – Students will be expected to pass regular assessments over the material covered in class.

Physical Fitness – Student participation in physical fitness activities will be evaluated daily with grades assigned for proper dress in issued Navy physical fitness gear and level of effort expended. The NJROTC Physical Fitness Test will be administered once each quarter to provide an objective assessment of student physical fitness performance.

Leadership - Students are expected to participate in class, community service and extracurricular activities. Each student will receive a semester Performance Evaluation completed by the student’s immediate superior in the chain of command which will be combined with a self-assessment to determine the leadership grade.

OHHS PLAGIARISM POLICY:

Any student, who knowingly turns in any work that has been done by someone other than himself or herself, and fraudulently represents it as his/her own, shall be considered to have cheated. Cheating also includes: aiding someone else in cheating, the use or preparation of written, pictorial, electronic or other materials not authorized by the instructor during a test or assignment, the use of testing materials obtained previous to the test date, or plagiarism of any kind. Students found cheating will also be subject to an office referral, which could result in a suspension. As an effort based school, students
